#10 (tie) Teaching Techniques for the Young Teachers - Dennis Hopkins

This clinic focused on class procedure, problem solving, how to prepare, and what it takes to be a great teacher.

#10 (tie) No Double Reeds? No Horns? No Problem! Making the Music Fit Your Band - Merlin Patterson

With demonstration band Cypress Creek High School Band (Jerry Choate, director), this clinic offered techniques for scoring band music to accommodate deficiencies in instrumentation and compensate fro weak sections.

#9 The Art of Selecting a Successful Contest Program - Greg Countryman &

Cindy Lansford This discussion centered on the many aspects that need to be taken into consideration when selecting music for contest, as well as specific procedures for choosing appropriate music for your ensemble. A list of grade 1 & 2 pieces with an overview of their strengths and challenges was offered (and is included in the handout).

#8 Spotlighting the Success Concepts for the Young Band Director - Dr. Tim

Lautzenheiser Dr. Tim focused on the important fundamental cornerstone attributes of master teachers. All outstanding band programs have one common denominator-a talented, organized band director/music educator/ caring mentor. The keystone ingredient to musical excellence is sourced from the podium...and in countless ways.

#7 Integrating VISUALS into Your Marching Band Show - Frank Trovka &

Amanda Drinkwater These two respected directors offered their thought process of integrating visuals from concept, to vision, to design, to reality and finally to performance.

#6 The OCD Approach to Taking a Band to UIL Contest - John Benzer

This clinic offered an extensive overview of the many responsibilities that a director has—both before and during the actual contest day focusing on a step-by-step process of student organization and expectations from arrival through the entire process of warm-up, stage performance, sightreading and departure with equipment.

#5 Creating the Meaningful Rehearsal - Phillip Clements

This clinic explored planning, methods, and techniques to create rehearsals that have a true effect on our students' musical development including creative strategies and ideas for literature selection, rehearsal structure and conceptual teaching that will allow the students to grow musically and retain information beyond the rehearsal.


