A Successful Vertical Team:

Demonstrates collegiality in the relationships among its members. They create instructional experiences to support each other – not to compete with each other.

A Successful Vertical Team:

is collaborative, feeling secure in calling on one another to discuss new ideas or strategies that help build their expertise and contribute to student achievement.
