#### THE THREE LEVELS OF PERFORMANCE

LEVEL ONE - Technical. Basics: Tone, Intonation, Rhythmic & Technical Proficiency

Technique. Wonderful Sound. All are quite astonishing, but it is not enough. Pablo Casals

\*Construct a practice model.

\*Daniel Coyle: The Talent Code

LEVEL TWO - Intellectual. Texture: Balance, Blend, Hierarchy of Lines

\*Teach students how to listen, and what to listen for

\*Listen beyond your part & become a part of the musical whole

\*Teach students to be analytical, creative & to think for themselves

\*Two ways of rehearsing: 1. Give the student the answer

Give them options & let them tell you what they think, hear and feel.

\*Eliminate Herr Von Kontrolfreaken!

LEVEL THREE - Emotional. Musical considerations: Dynamic Contrast, Nuance, Style, Phrase Shape
