Rules of Thumb: Never Rehearse more than parent group, Once you say yes, do not cancel, Share w/Head Director group's M.O.

development in the band program. These concepts will be discussed and brought to life

1. Instrumental Pedagogy:

- -Airflow/Breathing
- -Band Face
- -Sound Concept
- -Reference Recordings
- -Rhythmic Interpretation
- -Reading Skills
- -Promotes independency

2. Ensemble Pedagogy:

- -Start with all playing full sounds
- -In ensemble, Performers must match pitch
- -Must match sound energies
- -Within section, Lead on top
- -Strongest Section in Ensemble cannot dictate Balance of Group
- -Not a chorale blend, Keep it tune-full, must hear melodies, instruments, colors/chords.
- -Left Side of Group people, must hear tune or rhythmic patterns
- -Articulations: tOH, dOH, tONE, DAHT vs. DOT
- -Releases!
- -Easier to develop/refine skills (listening, etc.) because of number of performers

3. Stylistic Refinement:

- -Saxes must have correct Mouthpieces
- -Bring Brass Sounds from Concert Band
- -Rhythm Section Tones must be Legit!
- -Style not always on a judge sheet, but this makes the difference!
- -Work the "Swing" Don't give up! It is a legato expression. (Ooo-Va, Ooo-Va)
- -Ballads-Straight eighths, unless Jazz Ballad-swing
- -Funk-Straight eighths
- -Latin-Straight eighths
- -Warm-Up with the different Styles
- -Secret Ingredient to Style: Listen to Tune, Position along with Tune, Play along with Tune. Repeat.
- -Having a good sense of time is your foundation for Success!

4. Performance (Fearlessly)

- -Let the bosses know your group is available
- -Work the PR
- -Attend a Festival
- -Improvisation develops Creativity
- -Ambassadors for School
- -Invigorating, Exciting, High-Energy Music

The Rio Grande Valley Jazz Orchestra was founded in November 2017. Our purpose of the organization is to provide talented music educators an opportunity to perform in a big band for students and communities in the Rio Grande Valley of Texas to enjoy. The ensemble is comprised of almost all music educators who reside in Harlingen and Brownsville, Texas (no professional musicians participate). The group enjoys a 6-7-month season ending with a grand performance at the RGV Jazz Festival that sees over 25-30 area ensembles participate. All performances have been free and open to the public and have received overwhelming enthusiasm.

The Rio Grande Valley Jazz Orchestra will perform at the Midwest Clinic in Chicago this December 2018.
