Music

- → Achievement
 - Technical Facility
 - Every performer must have a show that they can perform successfully.
 - Feature moments
 - Range
 - High Brass
 - Low Brass
 - Woodwinds
 - Rhythm
- → Volume
 - Geography
 - Can you move them closer?
 - Scoring
 - Can you add another section for added volume?
 - Visual Demand
 - Simplify the demand drill, choreography
 - Simplify the music
- → Color
 - Electronics
 - Think of as a separate voice in the score
 - Not meant to just double wind parts
 - Percussion
 - Overbalance
 - Color
 - Feature moments
- → Timing Issues
 - Identify where the issue is.
 - What are the performers hearing?
 - Entrances
 - Elimination/Addition

Visual

- → Achievement
 - Too Difficult
 - Alternate forms of travel
 - Use a range of drill sets
 - Too Easy
 - Add movement/variation
 - Layer the step-off/arrival
 - Pulse considerations

→ Interest

- Are you visually representing the musical phrase?
 - Think like a choreographer!
- Is the visual focus in the correct location?
 - Doesn't have to be with the soloists, it needs to be where you are creating the idea.

→ Focus

- Add choreography
- Add color through equipment/fabric
- Add motion or stop motion

Structure

- → Evaluate the entire production
 - Where do you lose interest?
- → Work to be less functional and more musical
 - Be careful of transitional moments
- → Cut a section
- → Add development
- → Transitional
 - Color Guard
 - Drum Majors

Rehearsal

- → Field teaching
- → Tower teaching

Planning

- → Macro Planning
- → Rehearsal Plans
