- Planning
 Staff Meetings
 Calendar
 Facilities
 Lesson planning (paper or digital?)
- Procedures: HAVE A PLAN
 You can't adjust your plan when things go wrong if you don't have one! Be consistent
- Physical Space
 What makes the most sense?
 MS vs. HS
 Delegating set-up/tear-down

Organization, continued

- Documentation
 - Write down everything
- Communication
 - Email, Remind texts, phone calls, CHARMS, Presto, etc.
 You can never communicate too frequently.

 - Be brief and professional.
- Time Management
 - Alarms on phone/watch for pack-up time
 App "Timer With Sections"
 Analog clocks in every teaching space
